DESTINATION SPOTLIGHT - WATERFALLS

Lvming Dingdo Waterfalls

Between Daporijo and Nacho just 10 Km before reaching Nacho located on the highway, this waterfalls has its own unique features where waterfalls from huge tall flat stone surface of around 30-35 meters. Different seasons across the year provides different its views, thus making it unique.













Bemi Waterfalls

38km from Nacho on the highway towards Limeking is Bemi waterfalls. Positioned so close to the road, and quite tall in height, travellers cannot easily spot the source of the fall. However, the cascade tumbling along the rocky terrain in between a thick green cover makes it a sight to behold.





Tachuno Waterfalls

35 kilometers ahead of Nacho, nestled between Nacho and Limeking along the highway, is an ideal spot for a rest and refreshment while journeying beyond Nacho. This waterfall boasts its own scenic beauty with a 40-meter drop, as surveyed by the Survey of India.







SHERE THAPA MEMORIAL (HERO OF 1962 WAR)

The Martyr Memorial of Shere Thapa is 50Km from Nacho near the Kete Nallah village. The memorial commemorates the heroism of Shere Thapa who during 1962 Indo-Chinese war stood against the Chinese battalion along, killing 70 Chinese soldiers. This story of this legendary fighter is popular here. He was part of the protective patrol keeping watch on Chinese mobilisation.

On November 18 1962 the Indian protective patrol team was attacked by over 200 Chinese troops. The badly injured team was led by Shere Thapo and he single handedly manned the LMG until ran out of ammunition.



The brave action of Shere Thapa won the hearts of people of the region who still hold him in high regard. Reportedly, even the Chinese recognised his bravery when they realised that the stiff resistance from the Indian side was led by a single person. The Chinese buried his mortal remains on this spot and kept a wooden epitaph near his body with an inscription in Chinese appreciating the fighting qualities of Shere Thapa.
